Otis McAllister dedicates itself to childhood nutrition in India and Guatemala

IN 2011, OTIS MCALLISTER AFFIRMED its commitment to childhood nutrition by funding two key nutritional programs.

Otis McAllister continued to support Children of Faith Orphanage in Vizakhapatnam, Andra Pradesh, India. As the largest importer of rice to the United States, we know the important nutritional value grains offer. This year, we renewed our support of COF Orphanage by supplying a year's quantity of rice

to ensure their children are well-fed and so that COF can focus their resources on other crucial programs including education and medical care.

Otis also renewed its partnership with Guatemalan non-profit organization Potter's House to fund their 2011 Nutrition Program. The Nutrition Program provided 44,903 nutritional lunches this year, each day serving 225 children enrolled in their Educational Program. These lunches are usually the only warm, well-balanced

meal that the children receive each day. For 25 years, Potter's House has served the needs of children and families that live and work in the Guatemala City garbage dump, one of the poorest and most dangerous areas of the city.

Otis McAllister has pledged to continue both of these programs in 2012.

Global Childhood Hunger

- UNICEF estimates that nearly 1 in 4 children are underweight in the developing world
- This year, 9 million children below the age of 5 will die needlessly, more than half from hunger-related causes
- Twenty-three percent and forty-eight percent of children are suffering from being underweight in Guatemala and India, respectively

Otis McAllister develops strong partnership with VIDA USA

THIS YEAR, OTIS MCALLISTER partnered with VIDA USA in their mission to provide medicines, medical supplies and equipment donated by Bay Area hospitals, clinics and individuals to underprivileged communities in Latin America.

Otis McAllister was honored to sponsor five ocean containers this year including two to Mexico and three to Peru. In Peru, VIDA distributes supplies and equipment to over 250 institutions throughout

Peru's 12 regions. A special program, Puente de VIDA also provides free medical consultations, nutrition and prenatal care to rural communities in the Amazon, Andes and Coastal Deserts through mobile medical clinics. For every dollar we contributed to shipping, \$120 of life-saving medical aid was sent to Latin America.

In 2011, VIDA shipped a total of 40 containers to Latin America and the Caribbean valued at over \$30 million.

Since its founding in 1991, VIDA has carried over \$500 million in aid and diverted over 1,200 tons of viable medical supplies from Bay Area landfills. VIDA has served over 4 million people in 12 countries throughout Latin America and the Caribbean.
